

PARK EAST CIVIC ASSOCIATION MEETING

The meeting began at 7:05 with the reading of the Feb. 07 minutes. The minutes were accepted as read.

TREASURERS REPORT: Rich Nortmann reported that we had 20 paid members at the start of the meeting, and a dollar balance of \$1,984.74

SHERIDAN STREET PROJECT:

A report of the improvements to SHERIDAN ST. was given by Michael Melendez. the project is underway beginning at St. Road 7, 441 east to Dixie Hiway. Michael spoke of improvements to street lighting, traffic signals, their placement and timing, as well as turning lanes. Jim Nash suggested a need to improve the westbound turn from SHERIDAN onto PARK ROAD. Michael said that most traffic signals, and turn lanes are controlled by BROWARD COUNTY, and or DOT. All agree that SHERIDAN ST. at I95 is a confusing intersection.

GUESTS:

Linda Sherwood and Ed. Haulideck spoke on their upcoming bid for City Commissioners office. Mayor Giuliani spoke of her desire to continue as our Mayor. Dick Blattner spoke of YMCA construction. Sal Oliveri spoke of the improvements of Rotary Park and his willingness to help us. Peter Bober spoke of his desire to be our new Mayor, and asked for our help.

CODE ENFORCEMENT: Clay Milan spoke of adding code enforcement officers and that a upcoming Code Enforcement class, consisting of four, three hour class will be offered in May. ROTARY PARK IMPROVEMENTS: A detailed report was given on the upcoming improvements, including fences, lights, fill and sod, rest rooms, and parking. Trash containers and their placement as well as additional parking was reviewed.

HCCA:

Chuck reminded us of the upcoming commissioners meeting and the 2nd reading of the lobbyist ordinance.
